Executive Master of Public Administration Intensive Field Experience — Student Trip Fee 2021-22 Academic Year

Each Executive MPA cohort has the opportunity to travel for two one-week intensive field experience courses. In the first six months of the program, students will travel to Washington DC for PA 539 National Policy Process Seminar. This seminar is designed to give students a weeklong deep dive into policy process at the national level.

During the cohort's fifth term in the program (the second fall term), the cohort will split into self-selected groups to travel to South Korea or Vietnam.

National Policy Process Seminar

We are greatly inspired by the legacy of the late Senator Mark O. Hatfield. Senator Hatfield, 1922-2011, espoused a vision of bipartisanship, social justice, science-informed policy, localized governance, environmental protection and restoration, and place-based leadership and problem solving. The National Policy Process in Washington, D.C is celebrating over 40 years of seminars. The NPP was initiated in 1976 and has been offered by the Mark O. Hatfield School of Government since 1996, following the merger of the Lewis & Clark College of Public Administration with Portland State University.

The student fee of \$2000 for this trip will be billed in two equal installments: the first \$1,000 billing in term one of the program and the second \$1,000 billing in term two of the program. This fee covers lodging, faculty/staff travel to facilitate the course, a guided bus tour, 3 cohort dinners, and small gifts for those we meet with during the seminar (see full breakout below.)

Vietnam Case study Details:

The EMPA students have the unique opportunity to travel in partnership with the Vietnam Oregon Initiative, whose mission is to leverage the existing diverse relationships across government, business, and academic sectors between the State of Oregon and Vietnam for mutual trust and deepened partnerships.

Our Values:

The values of Mark O. Hatfield, what we call the "Hatfield Way", drives the conception and operation of VOI. Senator Hatfield was moved to life in public service by his initial visit to Hai Phong harbor immediately following World War II. The Hatfield Way includes the following core values:

- Do what is right in interaction with diverse others;
- Be fair and promote social justice;
- Allow space for the voice of under-represented humans and natural resources;
- Participate in the formation of innovative institutions in service of the common goods;
- Be mindful of, and balance, competing public values; and
- Resolve conflicts and aggression peacefully.

These values are compatible with many of the core values of Vietnamese society. One additional value that VOI embraces, grounded in its experience with successful cross-cultural partnerships, is that working together should be serious in nature and involve enjoyment of the human spirit-what we call "serious fun".

Students trip will be a week-long including a cultural immersion day to Ha Long Bay, dialogue with the National Assembly in Hanoi (Northern Vietnam), and travel to Hoi An/Da Nang (Central Vietnam) for a joint seminar with mid-career government professionals from Saigon (South Vietnam).

Seoul Korea Case-study

The other international trip option is to participate in a weekly long case study in Seoul Korea. Portland State University's EMPA is one of twelve programs with an established MOU with the University of Seoul/Seoul Metropolitan Government

Students will have lectures on Seoul's policies and will visit relevant field sites. The EMPA students arrive Friday evening for a Saturday cultural day and then join the rest of the case study participants on Sunday for a city tour that will give you the taste of the urban and traditional culture of Seoul.

Topics of past case study lectures included: Urban Planning, Transportation, e-Government, Water Management, Housing Policy, Waste Management of Seoul Metropolitan Government (SMG). Students

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will visit TOPIS (Transport Operation and Information Service), Cheonggyecheon Museum, Seoul Emergency Operation Center (EOC) and Waste Recirculation Center and etc. The topics of lectures and field visits are subject to change but will be firmly fixed by the 2nd week of October.

Students Participation

The Seoul Case Study Program has been designed to promote exchanges of ideas between the students and SMG. Not only does SMG share its good practices with the students, but it likes to receive their creative ideas. In each lecture session, students may voluntarily share opinions on SMG's policy. To facilitate more active exchanges of ideas between participants and SMG, there be group discussion sessions where students will form a group and give a presentation on Seoul's policies and offer suggestions.
