22 Tuition Classification Required

An Oregon "resident for tuition purposes" is a person who has, or a dependent person whose parent or legal guardian has, established and maintained a physical domicile in Oregon for at least 12 months. This must be a bona fide domicile rather than for the purpose of maintaining a residence incident to enrollment at the institution of higher education. Living, working, owning property or attending school in Oregon will not, in itself, establish legal residence for tuition purposes.

Students who depend on out-of-state parents for support are presumed to be legal residents of the same state as their parents. Residency information must be supplied by each person applying for admission to Portland State University. Omission of information will result in a tuition classification of non-resident. Application Instructions

- 3. Intended Major, Minor, Pre-Professional Program, or Certificate** – If you do not indicate a major, your major will be listed as undeclared in your student record. If you indicate a minor or pre-professional program, you should also indicate a major.
- 4. Social Security Number (SSN)** – The SSN is used for identifying and maintaining the security of records between individuals with the same name. Each student's SSN is kept confidential and, except for legitimate uses within the University, is released only when accompanying records that are requested to be released by the student. Social Security Number Disclosure and Consent Statement – You are requested to voluntarily provide your SSN to assist OUS (Oregon University System) and organizations conducting studies for or on behalf of OUS in developing, validating, or administering predictive tests; administering student aid programs; improving instruction; internal identification of students; collection of student debts; or comparing student educational experiences with subsequent workforce experiences. OUS will disclose your SSN only if the studies are conducted in a manner that does not permit personal identification of you by the individuals other than representatives of OUS (and organizations conducting the study for OUS) and only if the information is destroyed when no longer needed for the purposes for which the study was conducted. By providing your SSN, you are consenting to the uses as identified above. This request is made pursuant to ORS 351.070 and 351.085. Tuition Classification

- 22. Resident/Nonresident** – You must complete all information. Establishment of domicile in Oregon for 12 months or more prior to the term of entry is the first factor examined in determination of residency. Dependency on an Oregon parent/guardian, armed services personnel assigned to duty and living in Oregon, and Native Americans whose tribal boundaries were originally in Oregon are possible exceptions to this rule. Also considered is intent; your primary purpose in moving to Oregon. That is, if you have moved to Oregon primarily for the purpose of obtaining an education, you may not be granted residency. Also

examined are financial resources, as well as other indications that you intend to make Oregon your home.

You may be considered an Oregon Resident if:

- You moved to Oregon for reasons other than to attend school
- You have lived in Oregon for at least 12 months before registering for PSU
- You are financially independent and meet A and B above
- You are a member of a Native American tribe whose boundaries were originally in Oregon
- You have been approved for permanent residency in the U.S. and meet all other domicile and financial conditions
- You are a member of the armed services assigned to duty and living in Oregon
- You hold an A, E, H, K, L or other eligible visa or have been granted refugee or political asylum status **or**
- You are financially dependent upon an Oregon resident
- You have been claimed as a dependent for tax purposes by an Oregon resident who has been living in Oregon for at least 12 months

You may be considered a nonresident if:

- You are enrolled in a college or university more than eight credit hours per term within 12 months of moving to Oregon
- You have been claimed as a dependent on state and/ or federal tax returns by someone living in another state
- Your primary source of financial support comes from someone living outside Oregon
- You possess one of the following non-immigrant or temporary visas: B, C, D, F, J, and M

You must complete all questions in this section. Failure to do so may result in your classification as a nonresident. If you are under the age of 24 you must also complete the parent/guardian information. Additional information may be requested.

Admission Requirements

For U.S. Citizens and U.S. Permanent Residents

High School Students/Graduates

High school students who have graduated from standard, public U.S. high schools or regionally accredited private U.S. high schools must:

- Graduate from a standard or accredited high school with a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 in all graded subjects.
- Take the SAT or ACT and designate Portland State University as the recipient of your SAT or ACT scores. Portland State University is school code 4610. **Important:** Students who choose to take the ACT must complete and submit scores for the writing portion of the ACT.
- Complete 14 units of college preparatory work with a grade of C- or better, or meet Oregon Proficiency-based Admission Standards System (PASS) in the following areas:

English: 4 units

Mathematics: 3 units culminating in at least the Algebra II level

Science: 2 units (one year of laboratory science recommended)

Social Studies: 3 units

Second Language: 2 units of the same language. This requirement applies to any students graduating from high school or obtaining their GED in 1997 or any year after.

Non-Accredited or Non-Standard High School Students/Graduates

High school students from non-accredited or non-standard high schools or home-schooled students may seek admission to the university through the following alternative means:

1. Aptitude Tests

Students must earn a combined score of at least 1000 on the SAT Reasoning Test's Critical Reading and Mathematics sections or 21 composite on the ACT. Note: If ACT scores are submitted, students must also take the writing portion of the ACT and take two SAT subject tests (Math Level I or II, and one additional subject test of the student's choice). Students must earn a minimum score of 470 on each subject test. It is recommended that one subject test be in a second language to fulfill the second language subject requirement and meet Second Language Proficiency Requirement.

OR

2. Take Test of General Education Development (GED) and earn a minimum overall average score of 580 and a minimum score of 410 on each subject test and meet Secondary Language Proficiency Requirement.

OR

3. Enter Portland State as a College Transfer Student (See "College Transfer Students").

Note: If you graduated 3 or more years ago from high school, SAT testing not required.

No High School Graduation

Students who did not graduate from high school may be considered for admission based on scores from the Test of General Education Development (GED).

1. Students must earn a minimum overall average score of 580 and a minimum score of 410 on each subject test and meet Second Language Proficiency Requirement

OR

2. Enter Portland State as a College Transfer Student (See "College Transfer Students" below). **Note:** If the GED was taken prior to January 1, 2002 students must earn a minimum overall average score of 46 and a minimum score of 40 on each subject test.

College Transfer Students

1. Qualified students with 30 or more transferable quarter credits (20 semester credits) will be admitted as transfer students. Students with fewer than 30 transferable quarter credits must meet both the requirements for college transfers and high school students. Official high school and college transcripts must be submitted.
2. Meet minimum college GPA requirements: 2.25, with Associate's Degree 2.0.
3. Transfer students must have completed WR 121 or its equivalent with a grade of C- or better.
4. Meet Second Language Proficiency Requirement.

Note: Students earning a GED or high school diploma in the current year must also provide their official GED scores or high school transcript.

Second Language Proficiency Requirement

All applicants who have graduated from high school or earned a GED in 1997 or any year after must demonstrate proficiency in a second language. Students may demonstrate proficiency by meeting one of the following options:

1. Pass with a C- or better, two years of the same high school level second language
- OR**
2. Pass with a C- or better, the third year of a high school-level second language
- OR**
3. Pass with a C- or better, two quarters or two semesters of college level second language

OR

4. Pass a proficiency exam. Student must provide official high school or college transcripts to indicate the Second Language Proficiency Requirement has been met. For International Students

We accept international students for every term. Students applying from outside the U.S. are encouraged to apply at least six months in advance of the term of admission.

1. Minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) requirements:

- a. High School/Secondary School Graduates: Cumulative GPA of 3.0 when adjusted to the US 4.0 scale.
- b. Transfer Students: Cumulative GPA of 2.25 on 30 or more transferable quarter credit hours when adjusted to the US 4.0 scale.
- c. International transfer students must complete writing 121 with a C- or better either before admission or within one term of PSU enrollment

2. **English Language Proficiency Requirements:** Applicants who meet the English language proficiency requirement may enroll in academic classes. Those who do not meet this requirement will be restricted to ESL classes until the requirement has been met. Applicants may demonstrate English language proficiency by submitting the following test results: Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS): Students submitting the following scores may enroll in academic classes:

Paper-based test (PBT) 525, Computer-based test (CBT) 197, or Internet-based test (IBT) with minimum sub scores of 16 each for reading and listening, and 14 each for speaking and writing, or 6.5 or better overall score on IELTS with a minimum of 6.0 on each individual band.

Alternative Admissions

If you do not meet the admissions requirements as stated above, you will be considered for admissions based on a combination of GPA and test scores. Students who are not admitted using this combination of GPA and test scores may appeal to a faculty committee for special consideration.
