SPECIAL PROGRAM INFORMATION ABOUT THE MINOR IN ART

Those students wishing to complete a minor in art/art history must take all art and art history courses for a grade option (A-F).

All art and art history courses taken for a minor must receive a C- or if the course is to be used to fulfill departmental degree requirements.

It is strongly recommended that any sequenced Art course be taken in order. See catalog for recommended sequence and prerequisites.

During the first year in the program students are expected to meet with the main Departmental Advisor to review initial progress towards degree completion. Newly admitted transfer students should immediately make an appointment.

Dependent on concentration area the last 24 credits in art or art history must be taken in residence at PSU. (May vary with minor area.)

All prerequisites must be fulfilled.

It is highly recommended upper division 300/400 level courses should be selected in consultation with a faculty advisor. Please contact the Art Office for a list of advisors in your area of concentration.

GENERAL ART DEPARTMENT INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

All art and art history courses taken under the undifferentiated grading option (pass/no pass) will not be accepted toward fulfilling departmental major requirements. Including transfer credits from other universities and colleges.

Art and Art History minors can not use art history courses for both UNST credits and in fulfilling Art Department requirements. (They can be used only once for either UNST or the Art History requirements.)

Art and Art History majors have the responsibility to check the catalog for course sequence and prerequisite information prior to registration.

Any Art/Art History minor who does not have the recommended prerequisites may be asked to withdraw from a class.

All Art/Art History students must attend the first day of class or inform the instructor that they will be absent. Those failing to do so may find that their space has been given away to someone on the wait list.

It is highly recommended that new students transfer or begin their academic career in art at PSU in either fall or winter term. Those transferring in spring may find it difficult to join sequential courses already in progress.
