



**DO NOT EXPECT EXTRA CREDIT ASSIGNMENTS TO BE MADE DURING THE TERM.**

**Classroom Conduct:**

In class, in the interest of courtesy and respect for fellow students, disruptive classroom conduct will not be tolerated. Since it is important in a film class to be able to hear the film, students are expected to maintain quiet during class sessions. (If communication with fellow students is necessary, try the old-fashion way: write a note!) To encourage appropriate conduct, points will be deducted for the first infraction. If subsequent infractions occur, the student will be dismissed from class and will not be allowed re-entry without instructor permission.

**Grades:**

Your grade will depend upon the total of points you are able to compile over the quarter. The follow scale will determine your grade.

A= 90-100 points  
B= 80-89 points  
C= 70-79 points  
D= 60-69 points  
F, I, X= below 60 points

**(STUDENTS SEEKING A “PASS” GRADE MUST COMPLETE AT LEAST 75 POINTS)**

Keep all test and attendance material. Errors in grade tabulation will **not** be changed unless the student can document the error with returned materials.

Be especially careful with your exposure sheet. Do not leave it in your car, the library, or other places it may be stolen or lost. Loss of your exposure sheet can and will seriously effect your grade.

Work hard during the quarter to earn the grade you desire. Adjustments and changes in grades will **not** occur after the term is over except for the most unusual of emergency circumstances.

**The instructor retains the right to include in classroom activities, unannounced tests and other activities** through which the student may enhance their point total. To benefit from such opportunities a student must be present when conducted and meet all of the requirements included. Some opportunities may be random in nature.

**BST 511 – Graduate Students:**

Assignments for students seeking GRAD CREDIT will parallel those for BST 411, but performance should reflect the HIGHER EXPECTATIONS associated with grad-level work. Test answers must be more comprehensive and exact.
