Sadly I must report that Dr. Lisa Wilson will not be with us this next year as the half-time grant funding for her position was not renewed.

For the new 2004 cohort, I want to express how pleased the faculty are that you will be the first full cohort of students to participate in the Experiential Training Clinic to meet half of your personal counseling requirement. We believe this intentional small group experience will prepare you in a more powerful way for your time in the counseling skills class (Coun 543) and Practicum.

And as most of you know, I am the Counselor Education Program Director and have overall administrative responsibility for the program and how it interfaces with the Graduate School of Education as a whole.
