**Susan E. Halverson-Westerberg, PhD, MFT, LPC, NCSC**, is an associate professor at Portland State University. Her areas of expertise include couples, marriage and family therapy and school counseling. Dr. Halverson-Westerberg is a licensed marriage and family therapist, a licensed professional counselor, and a national certified school counselor. Her research interests include counselor development, grief work, and collaboration between school and family systems. She also teaches classes that include play therapy and sand tray therapy for working with children, adolescents, and adults.
