

CERTIFICATE IN EUROPEAN STUDIES

The certificate may be earned simultaneously with a BA or BS degree, or post-baccalaureate. Requirements for the Certificate in European Studies include:

CREDITS

Two years of one advisor-approved foreign language or equivalent proficiency. Currently PSU offers courses in Danish, French, German, Italian, Russian, Spanish. Occasionally other European Languages are offered through special heritage or summer programs. **24**

Advisor-approved area courses: No specific courses are required; a student may choose from a large number of courses that may be of particular advantage and interest to the student. **28**
