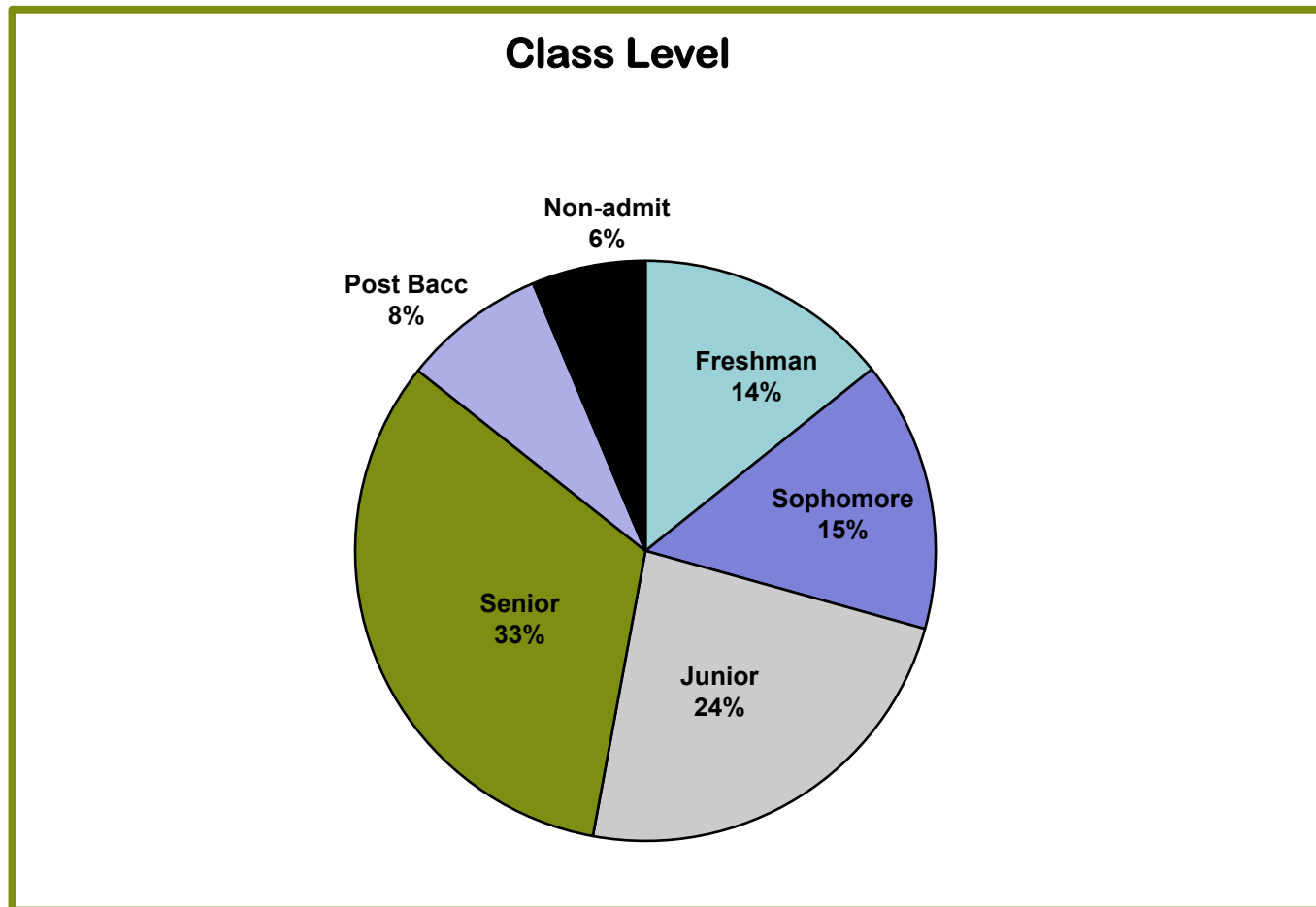
Faculty Enhancing Student Success

2. Student Development: Advising, mentoring and personal competency development contribute to retention and graduation

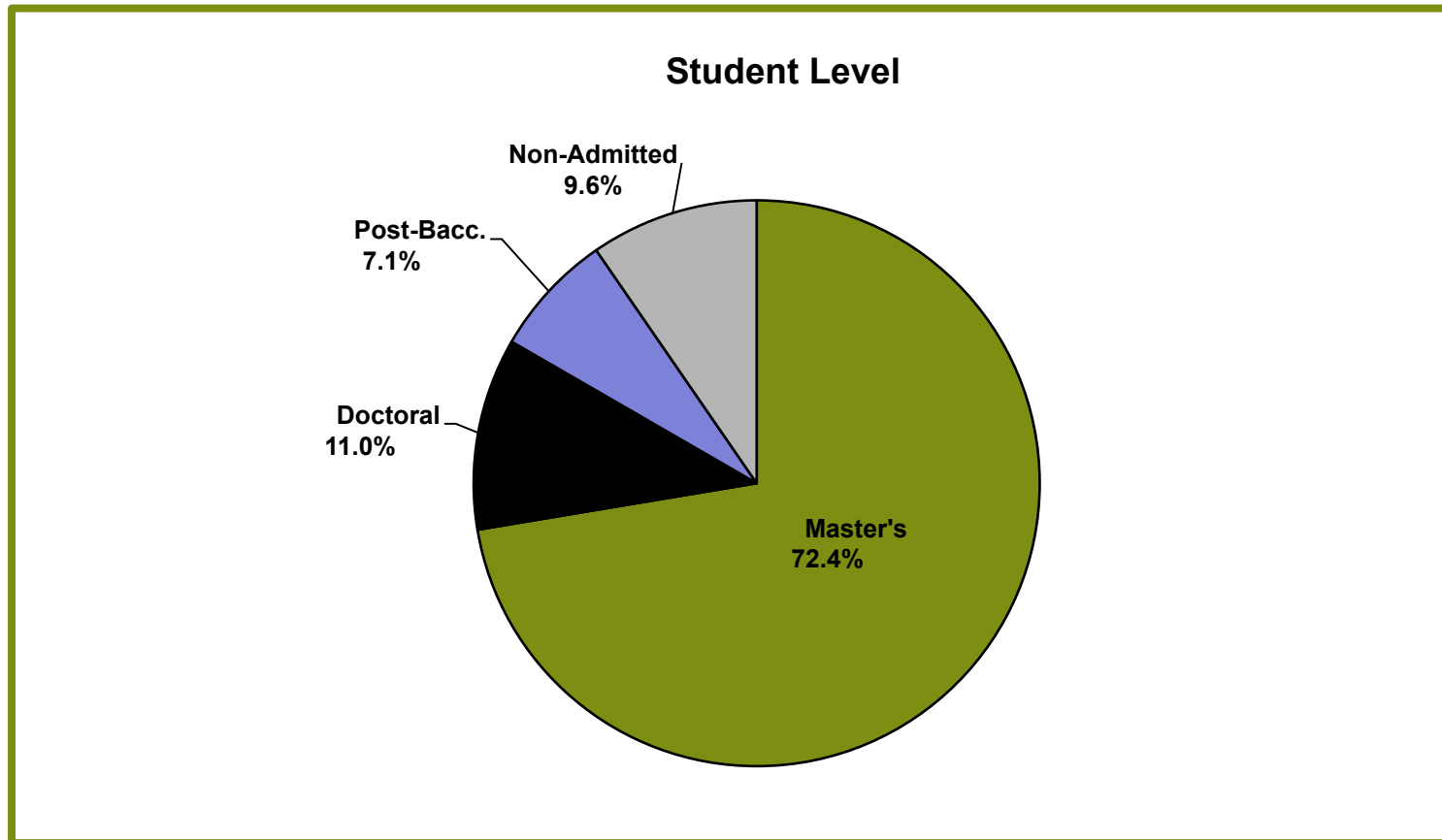
PSU Student Profile

Graduate Student Profile--Fall 2009

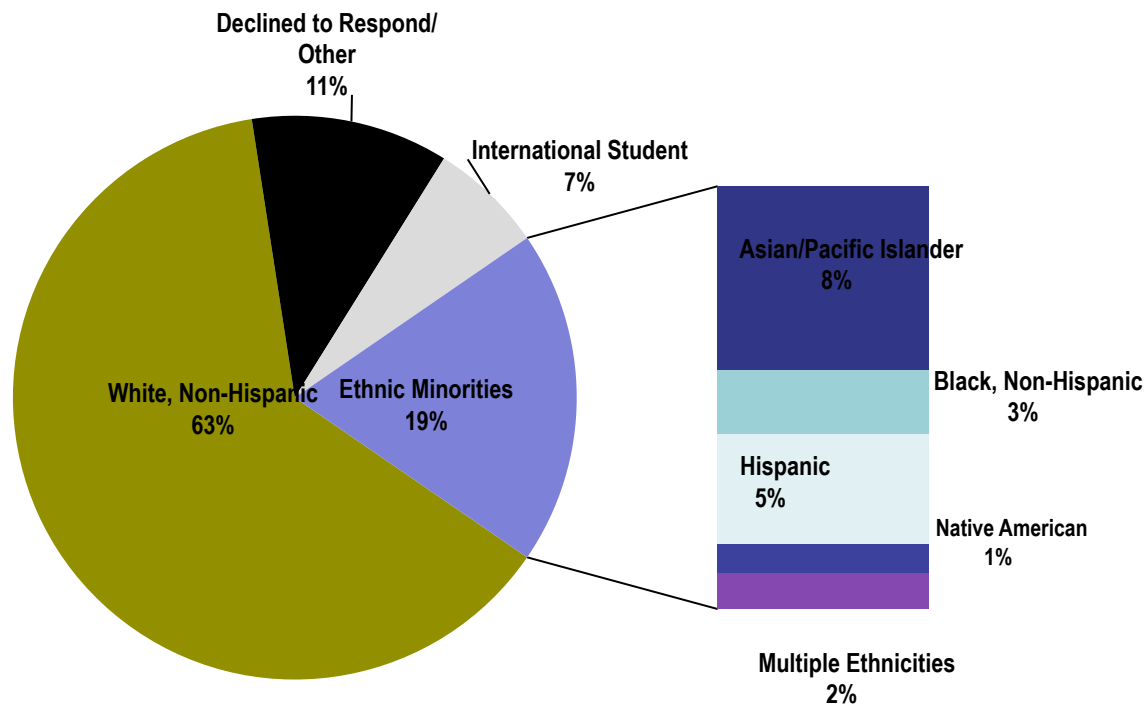


Fall 2009 Total Enrollment

- 3.2% GED

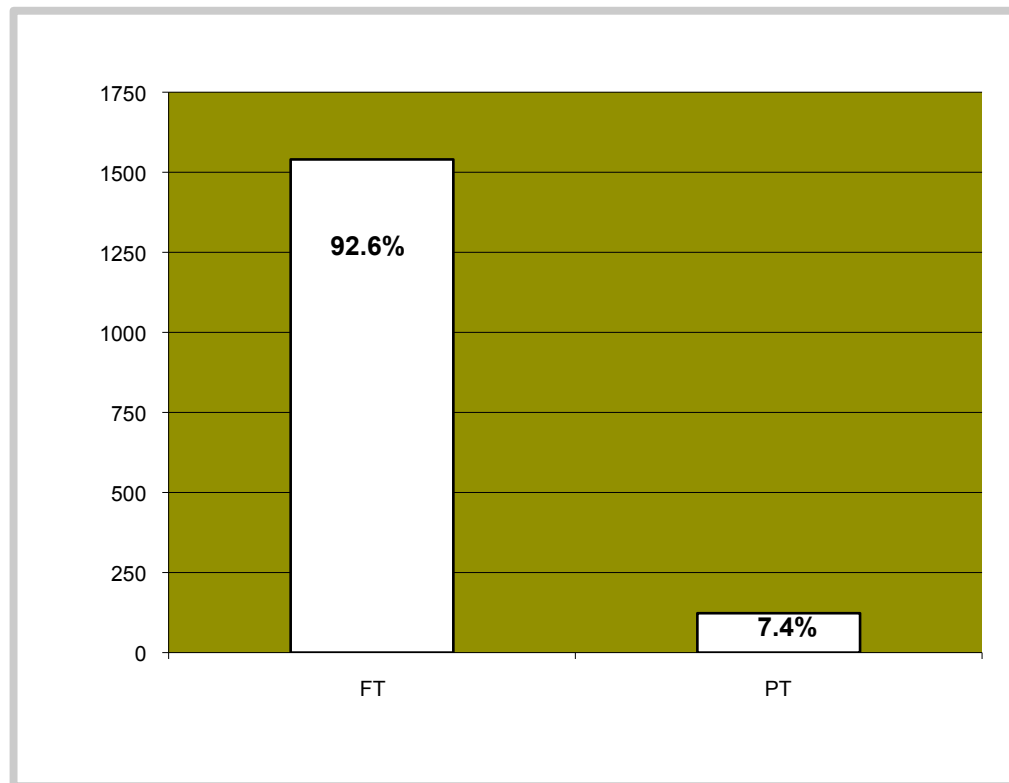
1st Time Freshmen--Fall 2009

1042



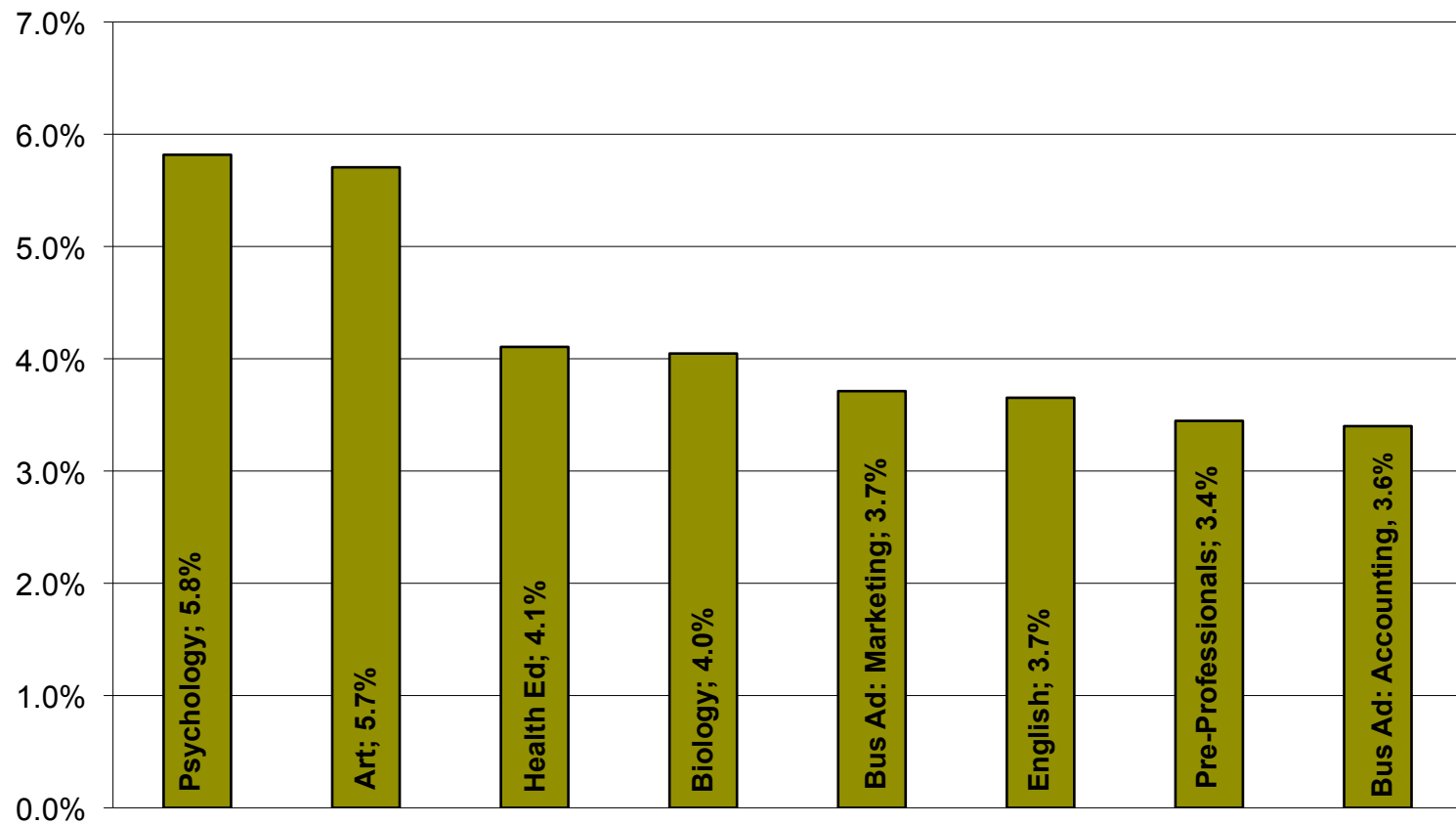

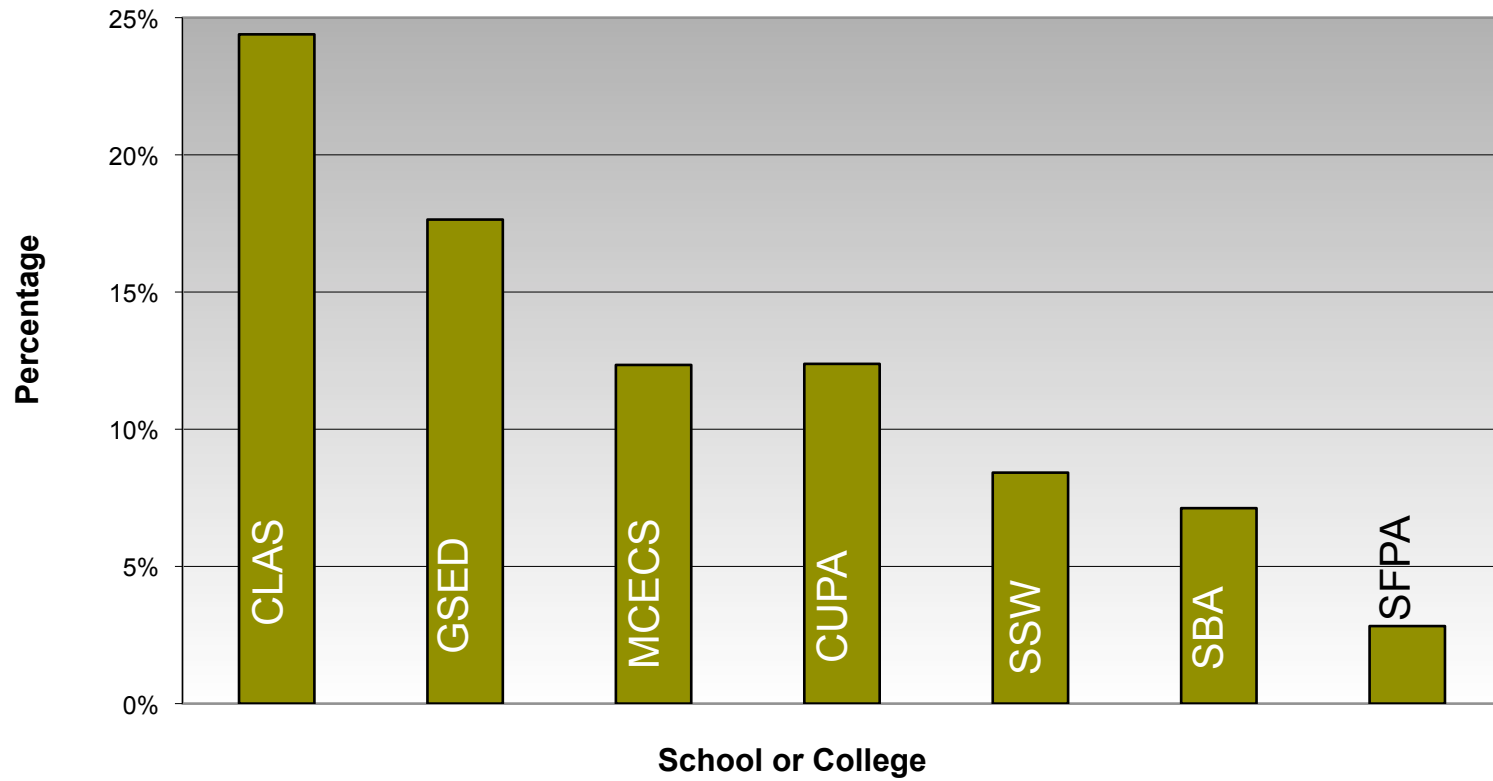
New Transfer Students -- Fall 2009
