## Campus Recreation / Intramurals

Portland State offers an extensive Campus Recreation Program available to all students, faculty, and staff. Use of all areas in the Stott Center is free for students (with a current student ID) except to rent a locker or use the pool which require a small quarterly fee.

## Personal Fitness

Students may use the Stott Center exercise facilities including a weight room and a circuit/cardiovascular room. Drop-in yoga, pilates, and aerobic classes and certified personal trainers are available for a small fee.

## Pool and Aquatics

Open lap swim and family events (including the ROCK and basketball) are offered each term. Clubs such as water polo and synchronized swimming also use the pool.

## Intramural Sports

Multiple sports, both competitive and recreational, are offered each term. You can sign up a team for Soccer, Flag Football, Volleyball, Softball, and Dodgeball among others. Or, if you don't have a team, just come as a Free Agent and we'll help get you on one!

## Rec Clubs

Over 25 popular recreation clubs provide students with several opportunities, such as sailing, crew, badminton, dance, racquetball, and tennis.

## Open Recreation

The Peter Stott Center open recreation program includes racquetball courts, basketball times, table tennis, roof-top tennis, and more. Using the gyms during these times requires a wristband from the locker room, which is free with a current student ID.

## Outdoor Program

An indoor rockwall in the Stott Center complements a host of outdoor adventures and trainings. Trips throughout the Northwest are scheduled regularly and include destinations such as Mt. Hood, the Snake River, and the Redwoods. Most trips require no previous experience. Students also have access to rent equipment from tents to skis to kayaks.
