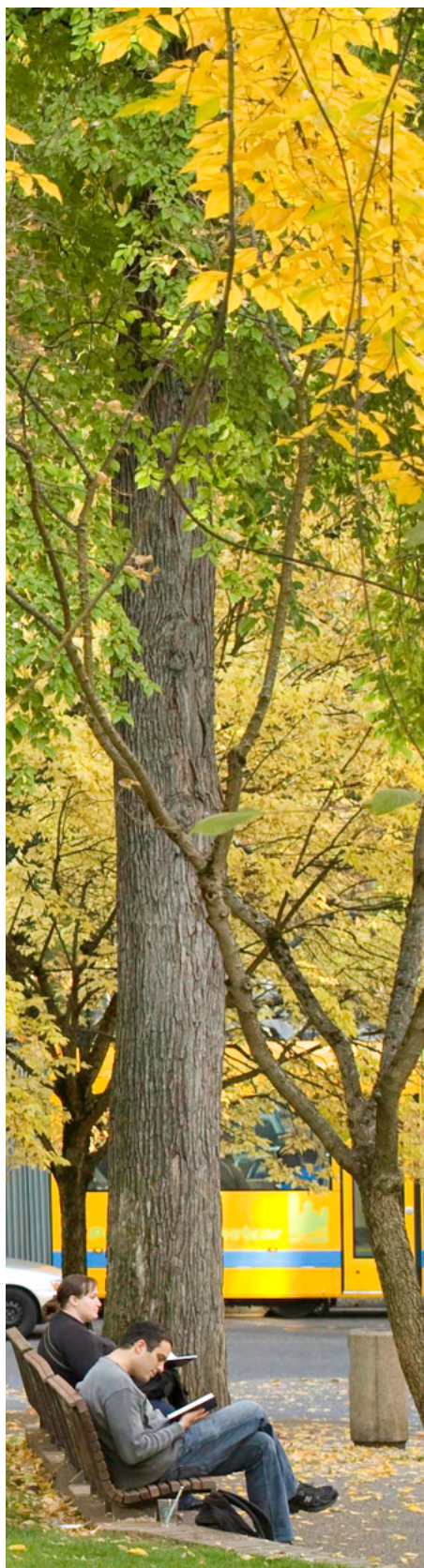


2025-2026 Hatfield Resident Fellowships

The 8-month Hatfield Resident Fellowship targets newly minted Master and Ph.D. graduates who have earned their degrees in the past year and possess both a strong record of scholarship and demonstrable interest in public service and leadership.

The paid fellowship is an academically rigorous, project-oriented, educational and working experience designed to provide each Fellow with an opportunity to enhance their leadership skills, expand their network, and add to their resume with a public service agency or nonprofit organization.

The program is designed for currently enrolled graduate students from a variety of public service disciplines who seek a project oriented, applied learning experience.

Ideal candidates will possess a strong record of scholarship and demonstrable interest in public service. In addition, they should have completed at least their first year of advanced degree work prior to starting their summer assignment.
