Review of Goals for FY 22-23

- Develop new procedures for building inspections which adequately notify employees in the location to be inspected.
- Incorporate new members of the Committee to diversify membership.
- Continue to collaborate with adjacent committees for workplace safety.

Accomplishments From FY 22-23

Quarterly Inspections

Implemented in FY 13, the Committee conducts quarterly building inspections as required by OR-OSHA.

Due to ongoing disruptions from the COVID-19 pandemic there were 2 building inspections during FY 22-23: Shattuck Hall in February 2023 and University Center Building in June of 2023. Committee plans to perform regular building inspections during the next FY.

Impact of Covid-19

Due to the continuing impact on campus operations, a sizable amount of the committee’s time was spent on addressing various issues related to regaining normal functioning post pandemic. With the increase of physical use of campus space, additional concerns were raised and addressed by members of the committee. With regular meetings, the committee functioned well as an additional stream of information for coordination of response.

Workplace Deescalation Training

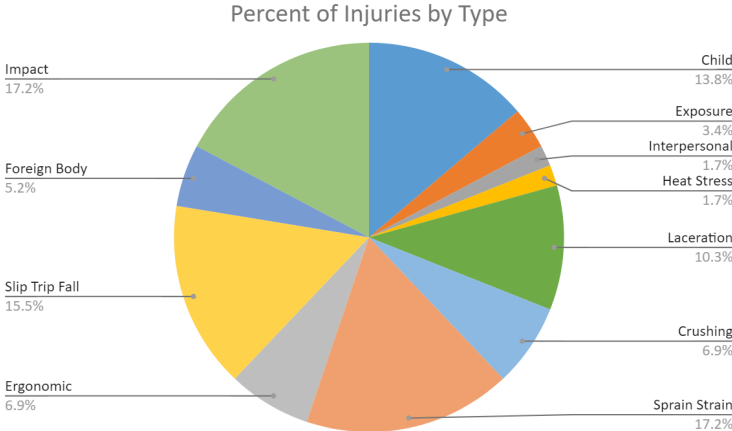

- Continue to perform outreach to other smaller ad hoc safety groups on campus to consolidate efforts. (UCB, CUPA)
