Duties and Responsibilities

- Create and support and welcoming and inclusive climbing environment.
- Supervise climbers during staffed hours while providing safety instruction, coaching, and belay assistance.
- Assist in training PSU Community in the proper use of the Climbing Center.
- Instruct Climbing Center courses.
- Route-setting and working for special events.
- Help ensure that all activities at the Climbing Center are consistent with the Portland State University, Campus Rec, and Outdoor Program policies.
- Report any issues regarding equipment, patrons, or co-workers to Climbing Center Coordinator.
- Mandatory attendance at Climbing Center trainings, staff meetings, and scheduled performance evaluations.
- Mandatory attendance of all Campus Recreation trainings.
- Other duties as assigned.

Expectations

- Commitment to Campus Rec's Mission and Values and Commitment to Equity
- Function and communicate effectively and respectfully within the context of varying beliefs, behaviors, orientations, identities, body sizes, abilities, and cultural backgrounds

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Working Conditions

- Typical Working Hours: Climbing Center Instructors are expected to work a
 minimum of 8 hours per week at Campus Rec Climbing Center located at 1800 SW
 Sixth Avenue Portland, OR 97201. Shifts are typically between 4-8 pm MondayFriday and Saturdays 10am-2pm. 4 hour setting shifts take place one day every
 other week. Staff meetings generally occur 3-4 times a term and last
 approximately 90 minutes.
 - Some additional evenings and weekends are required for special events including the Bouldering Competition in Spring and the annual maintenance period in late August/early September.
- Location of Work: Academic and Student Recreation Center Climbing Wall, Outdoor Program Office
- Type of Work: Aspects of this work include washing climbing holds, lifting and moving objects over 20 lbs, moving and using ladders, and climbing/setting climbing routes.
- Attire: Campus Rec staff shirt, nametag, closed toed shoes

Minimum Qualifications

- Be in good academic standing: (Minimum enrollment of 6 PSU credits for undergraduates, 5 PSU credits for graduates and minimum 2.0 grade point average undergrad and 3.0 graduate)
- American Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED certification within 30 days of hire for any employee who works within the Rec Center gated entrance and/or supervises activity areas or excursions. These certifications can be provided at no cost to you through Campus Rec.
- Bloodborne Pathogen Certification
- Must successfully complete a background check
- Must be available 9/8 9/10 and 9/15-9/18 for Fall trainings

Preferred Qualifications

- Experience with and enjoyment of climbing.
- At least one year remaining at PSU
