Kayak Pool Session Rules

Kayak Pool Session monitors are able to provide instruction to their ability, but are not certified kayak instructors. Please check in with each monitor about your learning goals.

1. Boaters must check in with Member Services (2nd floor of the ASRC) when coming to pool sessions.
 - *For Kayak Pool Sessions only, non-members are not required to have a member sponsor; however, they need to pay a \$15 fee and sign a waiver.*
2. Participants must register for session space (maximum 15) and can join the waitlist if the session is full. The in pool watercraft limit is 12 - boaters may have to wait or take turns during the session.
3. All boaters must take a shower before getting into the pool or spa.
4. Please make sure that your boat is free of debris and dirt before bringing it to Campus Rec. All personal boats must be thoroughly rinsed (with the float bag out) on the pool deck prior to being used.
 - *If bringing your own boat, place it near the pool's emergency exit and check in with Member Services. Go through the building, into the pool, and ask a staff member to open the emergency exit door so you can get your boat.*
5. A wet exit check will be conducted for first time users wishing to use a spray skirt while kayaking, and will be renewed annually.
6. Helmets will be available for people who wish to wear them. Please be conscious of pool edges (and other boaters) when rolling. No standing on watercraft.
7. Swimming activities and/or horseplay is not allowed during Kayak Pool Sessions.
8. Campus Rec policy specifically prohibits non-staff members from conducting paid instruction in the pool or other parts of the facility. (Policy 2.1.3)
9. Boaters will be expected to drain water and move boats onto pool deck by themselves unless a staff offers assistance. Adequately drain your boat before leaving the pool deck.
